Relocation Update

Here are some important updates about relocation:

- The next floors scheduled for relocation are floors 3–5.

As a reminder, no **move outs** will happen without an official 30-day notice from URS and no **move backs** will happen without a 7 day notice. Please feel free to call URS with questions about relocation.

- In July we will have an all resident meeting to discuss the relocation changes that have been made over the past few months. This meeting will be held at the YMCA. More information about this meeting will be coming soon.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

- Renovations on the 17th-22nd floor are underway
- Construction on the roof of Island Terrace has been completed.
- A helicopter will be on site **on Friday June 6th** to deliver materials for the next stages of construction. **Please be on the lookout for important safety information regarding the helicopter.**
- Renovations on the outer brick walls will begin in June which will start on the vacant upper floors.

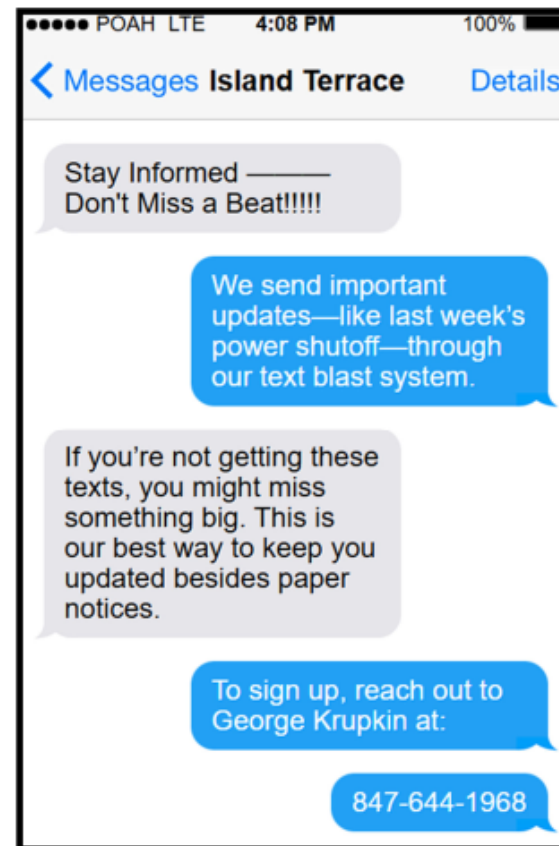
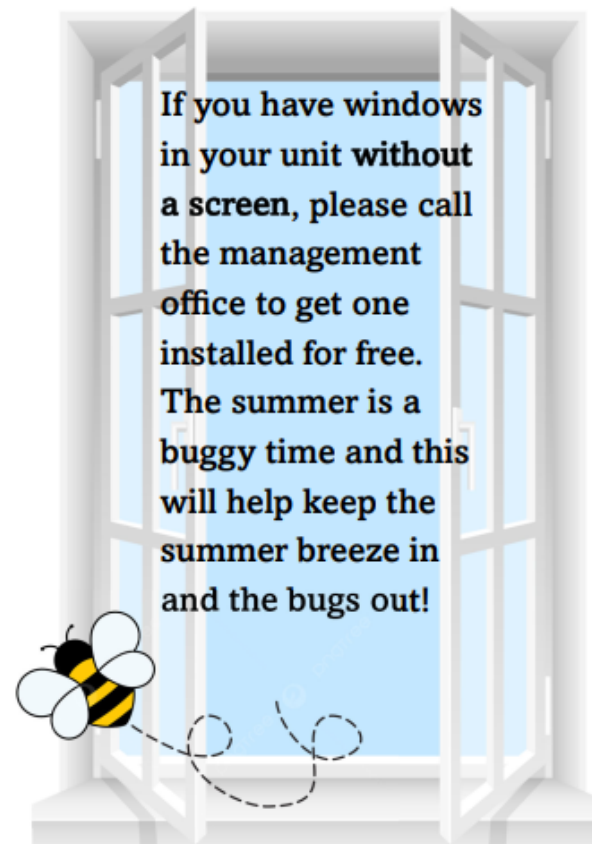

JUNETEENTH FUN FACTS

1. Juneteenth is also known as "Juneteenth Independence Day", "Freedom Day", or "Emancipation Day".
2. On June 19, 1865, over two years after the Emancipation Proclamation, enslaved people in Texas finally learned they were free when Union troops arrived in the town of Galveston.
3. Juneteenth is celebrated with parades, music, picnics, church services, and other activities. Look for these celebrations in the Woodlawn Community!
4. Juneteenth became recognized as a federal holiday in 2021. Juneteenth celebrations often feature soul food dishes like watermelon salad, red velvet cake, and hibiscus tea. These red foods symbolize the bloodshed and sacrifices made by enslaved Black Americans on the road towards Freedom.
